2005 Conclave a Huge Success

Host Lodge Nawakwa Delivers Top-Notch Program to SR-7A

April 29th through May 1st, Nawakwa Lodge #3 and the Heart of Virginia Council of the Boy Scouts of America were hosts of the 2005 Section SR-7A Conclave. Conclave Chairman Joe Orr and Adviser Roy Page planned for over a year for the weekend, and it was a great time for all.

The highlights of Saturday morning included training sessions on a variety of subjects, various activities, totem pole carving, visits to the Nawakwa Scouting Museum, and overspending at the trading post. Arrowmen from around Virginia learned about subjects ranging from Chapter/Lodge Relations to Publications (of course, the best session...I taught it!) to National High Adventure Programs.

Section Chief Wes Parker thrilled the crowd with a detailed, hands on presentation on the National High Adventure Bases of Philmont, Northern Tier, and Florida Sea Base and how the Order of the Arrow plays an integral role in the operation and maintenance of these bases. Assisted by veterans of all three basses, Wes introduced Arrowmen to the programs, opportunities, and typical gear at the bases.

Wahunsenakah Lodge 333 treated the section to a series of very interesting Native American Indian Training sessions and dances.

Saturday closed out with section elections (see page 4 for results) and an amazing closing show. A rocking concert

from Goochland based band *Zerohour* opened the show with ear splitting music. *Zerohour* was followed by an impressive rendition by John Hankins of his early summer camp experiences. After John finished his story the show staff presented a slideshow presentation of the weekend in review. The keynote speaker was Seth Mollitt, the National Vice Chief. We were very lucky to have Seth at Conclave, for he is busy with college and his responsibilities as Vice Chief.

As the show got into full swing, the ceremonial team presented and wonderful representation of the ordeal process and a retelling of the purposes of the Order. The rendition was enhanced by great background music and amazing pyrotechnics.

The show then went on to the awards section in which the various Section Awards are given out. After the awards, the Ceremonial Team preformed a somber closing, and the show was over.

Accolades to everyone who helped with Conclave, especially Region Chief Bradley Long, Section Chief Wes Parker, Conclave Chairman Joe Orr, National Vice Chief Seth Mollitt, all of the Conclave Vice Chiefs, and all of the trainers and staff. Conclave would not have been possible without their help.

Adviser's Minute




Brethren,




