2010 Conclave: April 23–25 at Camp Powhatan

Conclave 2009 will be hosted by Tutelo Lodge #161 at Camp Powhatan in Hiwassee, Virginia. The dates are April 23 through April 25, 2010. The lodge registration fee is \$50.00. Transportation will be coordinated by chapters. A conclave is where the lodges of the section (Section SR-7A consists of 6 Virginia lodges) get together for training, competition, and fellowship. Of course, the Saturday night block party is a feast that shouldn't be missed. Conclave also gives OA members the opportunity to visit the different camps across the state.

In order to register, please complete the online registration form (see below) and send your \$50 payment to the council office by March 5th. In order to pre-order any of the souvenir items (whether or not you plan to attend the event), please do so on the online registration form and send your payment by January 30th. Late registrations (with an additional late fee) will be accepted online with payment due to the council office my March 24th. Here are the steps for online Conclave registration and souvenir pre-order:

- 1. A Conclave participant will point their browser to www.sr7a.oaevent.com and select "Sign up for an Account."
- 2. The participant will enter an email address, personal details, select their council, create a user name and password, and click submit.
- 3. The participant receives email confirmation that an account is created.
- 4. The participant can then utilize that account to log into the system to register for Conclave.
- 5. After logging in, the participant will select "Register Now" to complete the online registration and select pre-order items. Then, the participant will be instructed to print a transmittal form which totals all monies due and is then instructed to mail the transmittal form to their council office along with a medical form. The BSA medical form is available for download on the OAEvent site. Please note that only sections A and C of the medical form are required to attend Conclave. A doctor's signature is not necessary for a participant to attend Conclave.
- 6. Once payment has been received, the participant's status will be listed as "Approved."

First Annual Spring Break Merit Badge Week: April 5-10

Any Boy Scout troop or individual scout is welcome to attend this full merit badge week at camp. Troop leaders that are working can still send their troop, as we will be providing two-deep leadership for any troops or individuals who would like to attend. Provisional troops will be made up of smaller troops and individuals to form troops of up to 36 youth members. This is a great opportunity for those Scouts whose parents are usually looking for someone to "look after" their Scouts because they have to work during the day. This is a win-win for the parents and the Scouts, as we will offer many Eagle-required merit badges as well as some very unusual merit badges that are never offered at summer camp. OA members are being sought to participate or serve on staff during Spring Break Merit Badge week. There are openings to help with merit badges and support staff, and there is also a need for Adult leaders to serve as Scoutmasters and Asst. Scoutmasters in "Provisional" troops.

There is no fee to serve on staff. Scout participants will pay \$165 for the week, while adult leaders will pay \$65. All of the merit badges will be staffed by registered merit badge counselors, and most badges should be able to be completed during the week. The Vigil Honor, conferred annually as a national recognition upon OA members, is a high mark of distinction reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions and noteworthy service to others through the OA and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors. The Vigil Honor was first bestowed upon E. Urner Goodman by the Unami Lodge in 1915. Lodges nominate Brotherhood members for the Vigil Honor according to specific national requirements, with nominations limited according to lodge size and a balance between youth and adult members. Those members whose lodges' nominations have been approved by the National OA office are inducted during a special overnight ceremony, and are bestowed with a name of honor translated in both a Native American/American Indian language as well as English. The National OA office issues a Vigil Honor certificate recognizing this honor with the honoree's given name and the Vigil Honor name in both translations.
