SummitCorps & Indian Summer

Two National OA Programs That You Shouldn't Miss!

In 2011, there will be two national events hosted by the Order of the Arrow that are sure to be hits among Arrowmen. First are the week-long sessions in July to help develop trails near the new permanent site for the National Jamboree, and next is the training/fellowship week of Indian Summer in August.

SummitCorps - New River Experience

The National Order of the Arrow Committee is pleased to announce SummitCorps - The New River Experience - a hybrid of ArrowCorps5 and our OA High Adventure programs. During July 2011, SummitCorps will provide service to the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia. Upgrading the trail bed of the Garden Grand Hike and Bike Trail, along with invasive species removal, will be the focus of the project. The Garden Grand Hike and Bike Trail connects the New River Gorge National River to the Boy Scout's new high adventure base and home of the Jamboree - The Summit: The Bechtel Family National Reserve.

The Nawakwa Lodge contingent has chosen the third session to attend: July 17-23. There are three other sessions open to attend if the one the

Lodge chose does not fit your schedule-1st) July 3-9, 2nd) July 10-16, and 4th) July 24-30. Similar to ArrowCorps5 and BSA High Adventure programs, the week will consist of service and recreation opportunities.

The cost for each participant is about \$250. Youth and adults may participate in SummitCorps. Lodge contingents are responsible for transportation to and from the event site. Youth OA members must be at least 14 years of age by July 1, 2011. Youth and adult Arrowmen who are registered members of the Boy Scouts of America, and the Nawakwa Lodge and have their council's approval, are eligible to participate in SummitCorps.

Participants will be required to meet the BSA High Adventure Height/Weight Requirements found on the BSA Annual Health and Medical Form and have a current health form.

Our Lodge currently has slots for 8 Arrowmen, so if you are thinking about attending the SummitCorps, don't wait. Visit www.nawakwa.org to sign up. This will be a great experience for any OA member. You not only get to help build the Summit camp, you will be one of the very few that will leave the
