NEW ADULT MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The national Order of the Arrow committee has modified the requirements for the nomination of adult unit Scouters to become candidates for induction into the Order. The changes will increase the number of currently-serving Scoutmasters and Varsity Team Coaches and other unit Scouters who can be nominated to be candidates. These modifications apply only to adult leaders in Scout troops and Varsity teams who are 21 years of age or older. They become effective at the beginning January 1, 2013.

The following requirements are from the *Order of the Arrow Guide for Officers and Advisers*:

Adult leaders in units: Each year, upon holding a troop or team election for youth candidates that results in at least one youth candidate being elected, the unit committee may nominate adults to the lodge adult selection committee. The number of adults nominated can be no more than one-third of the number of youth candidates elected, rounded up where the number of youth candidates is not a multiple of three. In addition to the one-third limit, the unit committee may nominate the currently-serving unit leader (but not assistant leaders), as long as he or she has served as unit leader for at least the previous twelve months. Recommendations of the adult selection committee, which consists of the lodge adviser, the chairman of the council committee on which the lodge adviser serves, and the lodge staff adviser, with the approval of the Scout executive, serving as Supreme Chief of the Fire, will be candidates for induction, provided the following conditions are fulfilled:

- Selection of the adult is based on the ability to perform the necessary functions to help the Order fulfill its purpose, and not for recognition of service, including current or prior achievement and positions.
- The individual will be an asset to the Order because of demonstrated abilities that fulfill the purpose of the Order.
- Fifteen days and nights of Boy Scout camping in the last two years including one long term camp of six days and five nights.
- The adult leader's membership will provide a positive example for the growth and development of the youth members of the lodge.

ATTENTION ALL ELANGOMATS

"Elangomat" is the Lenni Lenape word for "friend." The Order of the Arrow gives the title of Elangomat to Arrowmen who lead Ordeal candidates through the power of their example. Elangomats are like mirrors held to the candidates, who, through inspired leadership, reflect to the candidates their own innate abilities to accomplish the challenges of the Ordeal and lead a life of cheerful service. In this sense, the Elangomat may be one of the most important parts of the Ordeal experience, second only to the candidates themselves.



All leadership in the Order of the Arrow is by example. Therefore, in order to lead the candidates through the Ordeal, Elangomats volunteer to participate again in all of the challenges of the Ordeal along with the candidates, including scant food, silence, arduous labor, and the night alone. In approaching all the challenges, the Elangomat must be the representative of the entire Order, and lead by enthusiastic example and cheerful dedication. Candidates will approach the challenges with greater dedication when shown the example of an Elangomat who is similarly dedicated. As Allowat Sakima says, "He who follows such a pathway in unwavering cheerful service will be seen by many others and, by inspiration, lead them."

form if your physical was after 4/1/12.

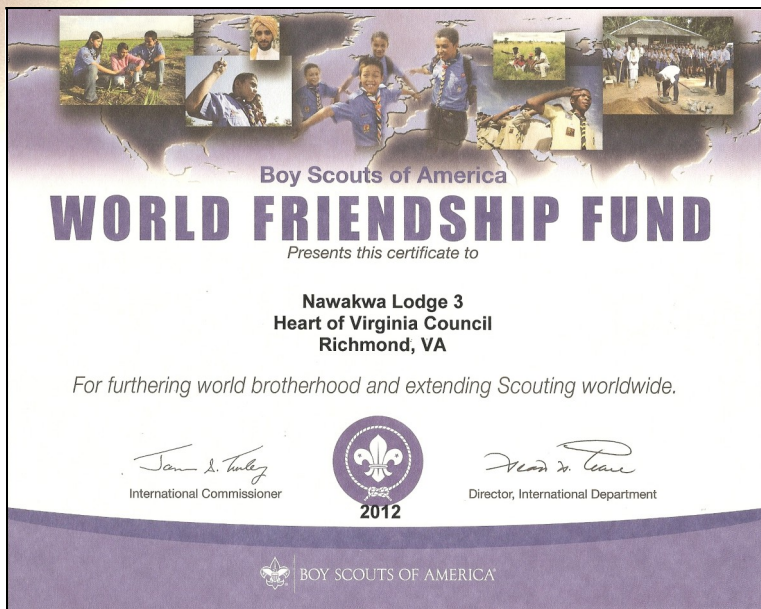
To make this event happen, we need at least 100 youth to attend, so please register today. With your support, this service project will truly be a living legacy.

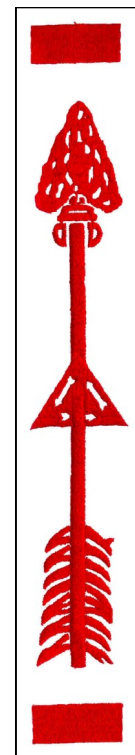
